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### Care after immunization:

- Normal side effects like pain and tenderness at the injection site, a slight fever or feeling tired are generally mild and last for 1 – 2 days.
- Acetaminophen (Tylenol®, Tempra®) can be given for fever or soreness. ASA (Aspirin®) should NEVER be given to anyone younger than 20 years of age due to the risk of developing Reye’s syndrome.
- Children can use their arm normally afterwards. For redness or swelling at the injection site, apply a cold compress.
