

**FISHING LAKE FLOOD SITUATION  
CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS  
June, 2007**

**March 21, 2007**

Saskatchewan Watershed Authority (SWA) and the Protection and Emergency Services (PES) Branch of Corrections and Public Safety (CPS) held public information meetings in the area to inform the public of the potential flooding and to offer available assistance.

**April 16, 2007**

A local state of emergency was declared by the Resort Village of Leslie Beach, which is part of the group of communities built around Fishing Lake.

**April 23, 2007**

Premier indicates in a media interview that the government is watching the Fishing Lake flood situation closely, to ensure residents receive compensation in a timely manner.

**April 26, 2007**

Previous Minister of Corrections and Public Safety Warren McCall and Minister of Environment John Nilson travel to Fishing Lake to view flood conditions. Ministers met with local officials.

**April 27, 2007**

Premier travels to Waldsea Lake, where he meets with local RM and community officials.

**April 28, 2007**

Premier travels to Fishing Lake where he views flood damage and meets with members from the community.

**April 30, 2007**

Premier announces government will appoint an individual to co-ordinate flood assistance measures at Fishing Lake and Waldsea Lake.

**May 8, 2007**

Ministers Nilson and McCall announce appointment of Bernie Churko to co-ordinate flood measures for Fishing Lake and Waldsea Lake.

**June 4, 2007**

Newly-appointed CPS Minister Ron Harper visits Fishing Lake and meets with community officials.

**June 13, 2007**

Environment Minister Nilson and CPS Minister Ron Harper announce flood assistance details to residents of Fishing Lake and Waldsea Lake in news conference.
