

BACKGROUNDER ON THE SASKATCHEWAN POLICE COLLEGE

- The Saskatchewan Police College was created in 1974 to provide career training for police recruits and professional development for existing police officers.
- The College is operated as a partnership between municipal police services, who provide instructors and resources lecturers, and the Ministry of Corrections, Public Safety and Policing, who fund the full-time staff and facilities.
- Each year, two classes of around 30 men and women receive 610 hours of instruction over 18 weeks.
- The College provides advanced in-service training for existing police officers that includes approximately 24 courses of varying length.
- Municipal police services from across the province sponsor recruits to complete training at the Police College.
