

Provincial Toilet Replacement Rebate Program Facts

Q: What is the Provincial Toilet Replacement Rebate Program?

- The Provincial Toilet Replacement Rebate Program (funded through the Province's Go Green Fund) provides a \$50 rebate per toilet to those who replace high flush volume toilets with newer more efficient models.
- High flush volume toilets are defined as those with flush volumes of 13 litres per flush, or greater
- Newer, more efficient models generally use 6 litres or less water when flushed.

Q: What is the Go Green Fund?

- The Go Green Fund provides financial support to Saskatchewan's people, communities and businesses to help them Go Green.
- The government of Saskatchewan is committed to addressing the environmental challenges we face today. The government offers a large number of programs designed to protect the environment, conserve energy and resources, address the issues of climate change and apply innovation to environmental issues.

Q: How does someone qualify for a rebate?

- Saskatchewan homeowners can qualify for a \$50 rebate per toilet (no more than three rebates will be issued to any one single-family household), if:
 - The new toilet is CSA-approved with a flush volume of 6 litres or less and replaces a toilet with a flush volume of 13 litres or more.
 - The new toilet is purchased after January 1, 2009. The original receipt(s) must be submitted with this application.
 - The home was built prior to January 1, 2009. This rebate will not be available to homeowners building new homes after this date.

Q: Are there exceptions?

- A toilet replacement rebate under this program cannot be combined with a similar rebate through the Saskatchewan EnerGuide for Houses Program.
- This rebate is applicable only to toilet replacements in Saskatchewan homes and multiple dwelling units.

- Multi-unit residential building owners who wish to apply for this program must obtain pre-approval from the Saskatchewan Watershed Authority.

Q: How do applicants receive their rebate?

- Fill out and mail the completed application form with the original sales receipt(s) and copy of installation receipt(s) (if applicable) to the Saskatchewan Watershed Authority.

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Q: Which low-flush model should you buy?

- Not all low flush and dual flush toilets offer the same performance. It is recommended that applicants research the many CSA certified models available to ensure the toilet purchased and installed is likely to meet performance expectations.

Q: How should the old toilets be disposed of?

- Applicants must adhere to all local landfill regulations when disposing of their old toilets.
