

Did you know this about the Saskatchewan Legislative Building?

- There are 34 different kinds of marble in the Legislative Building.
- The Legislative Building was originally going to be faced with red brick.
- The Legislative Building has four floors.
- From 1911 to 1948, there was a provincial lab in the Legislative Building that had a rooftop animal colony.
- There was a Credit Union (Sage Credit Union) on the fourth floor of the Legislative Building from 1969 to 1978.
- There are images hidden in the marble pillars of the Rotunda.
- The dome is 56 metres high.
- The Legislative Building is situated in one of the largest urban parks in North America.
- A white light shines in the lantern of the dome when the House is sitting evenings.
- The mural *Before the White Man Came* was cleaned using a process that uses saliva.
- The building's tour guides wear vests made from the Saskatchewan Dress Tartan, one of two official provincial tartans.
- The Legislative Library was the first library in the province.
- The first session in the Legislative Building was held in the Library.
- The foundation under the West Wing of the Legislative Building was reinforced in 1983. The Speaker of the Legislative Assembly wears a tri-corn hat.
- The Legislative Building is open seven days a week.
- The Legislative Building only closes three days a year – Good Friday, Christmas Day and New Years Day.
- The green carpet on the grand stairway is changed to red when the House is in Session.
- The Legislative Building had electricity from the day it was built.
- A beaver pelt and moose hide cushion for the mace, and a beaded runner were added to the table in the Legislative Chamber in 2006.
- A Métis sash was added to the Legislative Chamber table in 2010.
