# Background Information Tisdale Long-term Care Replacement Project

The Tisdale Long Term Care Replacement project will replace the Sasko Park Lodge nursing home. Once completed, an addition and renovation to Newmarket Manor nursing home will accommodate residents from Sasko Park.

When the first phase of construction is complete, residents from Newmarket Manor will move into the addition, allowing renovation of the existing building. Once those renovations are complete, residents from Sasko Park Lodge will be transferred to their new home, operated by Kelsey Trail Health Region.
