PROJECT: Highway 3 near Shell Lake

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Maintenance, patching

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: One lane closed, obey flag persons, expect delays of up to 5 minutes, reduce speed

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 4 near Biggar

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching on Highway 4 north and south of Biggar

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Watch for heavy equipment, expect minor delays, fresh oil and loose stones

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 8 near Langenburg

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching on Highway 8 north of Langenburg

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane, obey flag people and expect delays, loose stones, fresh oil

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 9 near Canora

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Spot sealing on Highway 9 from Yorkton to Canora

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane, obey flag people and expect delays, loose stones, fresh oil

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 13 near Stoughton

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 30 km of surfacing work on Highway 13 from the Stoughton junction to Griffin

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane, obey flag people and expect delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Late July 2012

PROJECT: Highway 14 near Wilkie

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching on Highway 14 between Asquith and Wilkie

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Expect minor delays, obey flag people, fresh oil and loose stones

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 15 near Ituna

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Installation of a culvert underneath Highway 15 between Goodeve and Ituna with spot sealing and hand patching between Ituna and the junction of Highway 6

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be reduced to one lane, watch for heavy equipment, expect minor delays and obey flag people

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer of 2012

PROJECT: Highway 22 near Southey

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Permanent repairs in several soft, low spots from Southey to Earl Grey to improve safety with further upgrades and paving in 2013

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be reduced to one lane, obey flag people and expect delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 22 near Grayson

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching and spot sealing on Highway 22 in the vicinity of Grayson, Neudorf and Lemburg

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane, obey flag people, loose stones, fresh oil

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Highway 23 near Porcupine Plain

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Spot sealing on Highway 23 between Somme to the Junction of Highway 38

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Expect minor delays, fresh oil

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highways 30 and 44 near Eston

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching in the Eston area

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Expect minor delays, fresh oil and loose stones

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 18, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 35 near Leross

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Installation of a culvert underneath Highway 35 between Lipton and Leross

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be reduced to one lane, watch for heavy equipment, expect minor delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 52 near Homefield

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Spot sealing and hand patching on Highway 52 near Homefield

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Watch for flag people, fresh oil and loose stones, expect minor delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 57 near Madge Lake

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching on Highway 57

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane, obey flag people and expect delays,

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June

PROJECT: Highway 106 northeast of Caribou Creek

ESTIMATED COST: \$30,000

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Minor bridge deck repair about 25 km west of the junction of Highway 165

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: One lane closed, traffic controlled by lights, reduce speed, watch for crews working

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 261 near Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 3 km of paving on Highway 261 from Highway 4 junction to 3 km east in the Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be reduced to one lane, obey flag people and expect delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 310 near Foam Lake

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Blading of the gravel road

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Be aware of the ridge in centre of the road

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 340 between Radisson and Hafford

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching, spraying oil and laying asphalt; flag people, gravel trucks, grader and packers present

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Expect minor delays, fresh oil and loose stones

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 342 near Clearwater Lake

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Grading work about 2 km east of Clearwater Lake access for about 7 km

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be reduced to one lane, obey flag people

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer of 2012

PROJECT: Highway 349 near Archerwill

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Blading of the gravel section of Highway 349 to the junction of Highway 38

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Expect minor delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: West Regina Bypass (Highway 1 and Pinkie Road)

ESTIMATED COST: \$43 million

START: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Work includes grading of the abutments, connecting of ramps and roadways and the bridge structure

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic lights at the junction of Highway 1 and Pinkie Road, reduced speed in construction zone on Highway 1, traffic may be reduced to one lane in both directions

ESTIMATED OPENING TO TRAFFIC: Fall 2013

PROJECT: Dalmeny Access Road near Highway 16

ESTIMATED COST: \$20.3 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of June 4, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 13.5 km of road widening and surfacing on Dalmeny Access between Town of Dalmeny and about 2 km south of the junction of Highway 16

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Motorists should be aware of blowing dust and equipment working in the area

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Spring 2013

ONGOING WORK

PROJECT: Highway 2 near Hoey

ESTIMATED COST: \$7.6 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of April 30, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Grading of about 8.6 km from about 10 km south of its junction with Highway 25 to the north and grading of about 1.1 km of a new access road to Hoey (work will take place along about 1 km of existing Highway 2 with the remainder of the work taking place along existing municipal roads)

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane, be aware of potential blowing dust

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Highways 2, 15 and 365 near Watrous

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 21, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching on Highway 2 from Liberty to Young continues, blading and patching on Highway 15 between the junction of Highways 2 and 20 and ongoing blading of Highway 365 between Manitou Beach and Plunkett

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Watch for heavy equipment, expect delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Late June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 4 near Saskatchewan Landing Bridge

ESTIMATED COST: \$2.1 million (surfacing portion)

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of April 23, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Surfacing about a 5 km truck climbing lane, truck pull-out and a passing lane south of the Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Minor traffic delays and disruptions, be cautious and alert

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 5 near Watson

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 21, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching from Wadena to Watson and north of Wadena to the junction of Highway 49

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane, obey flag people and expect delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 5 near Rama

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Work continues on Highway 5 with patching from Rama to Wadena

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Expect minor delays and reduce speed

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 5 near Humboldt

ESTIMATED COST: \$900,000

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 7, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Construction of turning lanes at three intersections with Highway 5 continues including the Carmel Access Road, Bruno Access Road and a grid road about 1.6 km west of Humboldt

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Motorists are advised to reduce speeds and be cautious and alert in the area

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highways 6 near Dafoe

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 21, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Laying of hot mix from Raymore to Dafoe continues

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Loose stones and fresh oil, expect delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 6 (Bridge work over Qu'Appelle River)

ESTIMATED COST: \$3.3 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Jan. 5, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Demolition of an existing 55-metre-long bridge and construction of a new 48-metre-long precast concrete bridge on Highway 6 over the Qu'Appelle River

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be stopped for short periods on Highway 6, truck loads will be restricted to 5 metres wide during the project, wide loads seek alternate routes

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: End of June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 6 near Southey

ESTIMATED COST: \$9 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 7, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Paving three different segments of Highway 6 totaling about 32 km including nearly 5 km stretching from the junction of Highway 99 heading north, another 6 km segment stretching from the junction of Highway 22 at Southey heading north and another 21 km segment north of Grid 731

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 7 near Rosetown

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching on Highways 7 and 31 in the Rosetown area

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Be cautious, alert, obey all flag people

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Highway 8 near Moosomin

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Installation of a culvert under Highway 8 about 20 km north of Highway 1

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be reduced to one lane, obey flag people and expect delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 10 (Guard rails for bridge over Qu'Appelle River)

ESTIMATED COST: \$200,000

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Work resumes on new guardrail on Qu'Appelle River Bridge about 1.5 km east of Fort Qu'Appelle

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane for short periods, drive with caution, watch for workers and equipment on shoulders

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June

Highway 11 (Louis Riel Trail) twinning between Prince Albert and Saskatoon

PROJECT: Highway 11 near Macdowall

ESTIMATED COST: \$6 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 13 km of grading work on new northbound lanes from 2.5 km south of Macdowall northeast (part of Highway 11 twinning between Prince Albert and Saskatoon)

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Motorists should be aware of blowing dust

EXPECTED TO BE OPEN TO TRAFFIC: 2012

PROJECT: Highway 11 from north of Duck Lake to south of Macdowall

ESTIMATED COST: \$11.4 million (paving only)

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: May 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 19 km of paving work on new northbound lanes from north of Duck Lake to south of Macdowall (part of Highway 11 twinning between Prince Albert and Saskatoon)

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Motorists should be aware of blowing dust and be cautious in the area

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Fall 2012

PROJECT: Highway 13 near Verwood

ESTIMATED COST: \$7.6 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 20 km of work on Highway 13 from Verwood to the east includes widening, surface mixing, sub-base and base followed by paving

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: End of August 2012

PROJECT: Highway 14 near Asquith

ESTIMATED COST: \$1.6 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Construction of a new 45-metre-precast concrete bridge on Highway 14 over Eagle Creek about 12.5 km southwest of Asquith

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane through the work area

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Late June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 15 near Milden

ESTIMATED COST: \$7.7 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 16.5 km of widening and repaving from about the junction with Highway 42 to Sovereign

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Highways 16 and 6 west of Wynyard

ESTIMATED COST: \$6.6 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 25 km of paving on Highway 16 from Wynard to Highway 6 and about 6 km of paving on Highway 6 between Dafoe and junction of Highway 16

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane through the work area

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Highway 16 west of Churchbridge

ESTIMATED COST: \$3.5 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 7, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 12.5 km of repaving between Churchbridge and Bredenbury

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane, flag people and pilot vehicle in attendance, expect delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Late June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 24 near Spiritwood

ESTIMATED COST: \$800,000

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Paving of a newly-constructed steel and concrete bridge on Highway 24 about 3 km north of Spiritwood

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be reduced to one lane during paving

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 27 near Prud'homme

ESTIMATED COST: \$3.8 million (grading portion only)

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of April 16, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Grading of about 8 km from the junction with Highway 2 to Prud'homme continues (paving project to follow)

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane, motorists should be aware of potential blowing dust and rough areas

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Highway 31 near Doddsland and Plenty

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Rubber crack filling, blowing sand off road between Doddsland and Highway 21, Laying of asphalt mix on various sections between Highway 4 and Plenty and repairs west of Plenty to Highway 21

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Dust, fresh oil, expect delays, follow pilot truck

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: End of June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 35 near Wadena

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching and laying of hot mix along Highway 35

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Expect delays and reduce speed

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 38 near Kelvington

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 21

DESCRIPTION: Patching in the area continues on Highway 38 south of Kelvington to the junction of Highway 5 and north to Perigord

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Expect slight delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 42 near Dinsmore

ESTIMATED COST: \$1.8 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Grading and paving at Dinsmore from near junction of Highway 44 to about 1.5 km west of its junction with Highway 44

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic in this area may be restricted to one lane, rough areas and blowing dust

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Highways 42 (Area of Dinsmore to Milden)

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of April 9, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Laying of asphalt, spot sealing, loose stones and fresh oil

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be reduced to one lane, obey flag people and expect delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: End of June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 44 near Eston

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching on roads in the Eston area continues

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Watch for trucks, be cautious and alert, obey all flag people

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Highway 51 near Major

ESTIMATED COST: \$1 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of April 23, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Grading work starting at Major and heading west for about 4 km (part of a multi-year partnership project)

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be reduced to one lane, obey flag people and watch for loose stones

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Highway 55 from Alberta-Saskatchewan border to east of Pierceland

ESTIMATED COST: \$18.2 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 7, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 26 km of work on Highway 55 from the Alberta-Saskatchewan border to about 10 km east of Pierceland, which includes grading along with the application of sand and gravel followed by paving

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane, motorists should be aware of potential blowing dust and watch for soft portions and fresh gravel, allow extra travel time

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Fall 2012

PROJECT: Highway 55 near Red Earth

ESTIMATED COST: \$4.1 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 17 km of construction is now taking place on Highway 55 from about 10 km east of its junction with the Red Earth access road to about 7 km west of the junction, work will include the placement of sand and gravel over the existing surface (upon completion, motorists will travel on an upgraded, dust-free surface)

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will potentially be reduced to one lane through the area

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Fall 2012

PROJECT: Red Earth Access Road near Highway 55

ESTIMATED COST: \$4.4 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 14 km of construction is now taking place on the Red Earth Access Road from its junction with Highway 55 to the north, work will include the placement of sand and gravel over the existing surface (upon completion, motorists will travel on an upgraded, dust-free surface)

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane through the work area

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Fall 2012

PROJECT: Highway 55 northwest of Big River

ESTIMATED COST: \$4.4 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of April 30, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 13 km of repaving northwest of Big River

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane through the work area

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Late June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 155 near Beauval

ESTIMATED COST: \$624,000

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION OF CONSTRUCTION: About 11 km of surfacing work from the junction of Highway 155 and Highway 165 to the south

CONSTRUCTION IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be reduced to one lane

ESTIMATED PROJECT COMPLETION: Mid June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 219 (Chief Whitecap Trail) north from its junction with Highway 15

ESTIMATED COST: \$11.7 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 7, 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 26 km of paving stretching from the junction of Highway 15 and heading north on Highway 219

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane at times

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Late June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 310 between Foam Lake and Kuroki

ESTIMATED COST: \$21 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: April 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 29 km of grading and paving work from 1 km north of its junction with Highway 16 to its junction with Highway 5

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Flag people on site, expect minor delays, potential for fresh oil and loose stones, rough areas and blowing dust

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Fall 2012

PROJECT: Highway 310 between Ituna and Foam Lake

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: April 2012

DESCRIPTION: Blading of the gravel section in the area on an ongoing basis

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Watch for equipment, potential for loose stones

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Highway 335 near Leather River

ESTIMATED COST: \$5.2 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Nov. 30, 2011

DESCRIPTION: Construction of a steel and concrete bridge on Highway 335 over the Leather River and construction of a 1 km long sub-grade and a surfacing structure on Highway 335 from about 7 km east to about 6 km east of its junction with Highway 35

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic will be detoured around the construction site

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: August 2012

PROJECT: Highway 340 north of Radisson

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching of highway 340 between Radisson and Hafford, spraying oil and laying asphalt

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Expect minor delays, watch for flag people, potential for fresh oil and loose stones

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 342 near Beechy

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching and spot sealing along Highways 342 and 42 near Beechy

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Fresh oil, flag persons and site, reduce speed and expect minor delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Mid July 2012

PROJECT: Highway 349 near Archerwill

ESTIMATED COST: \$1.1 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Construction of a new 24-metre-long precast concrete bridge on Highway 349 over Red Deer River about 11 km east of Archerwill

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane while bridge is being paved

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Late June 2012

PROJECT: Highway 365 north of Manitou Beach

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Blading gravel section of Highway 365 between Manitou Beach and Plunkett continues

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Expect minor delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer of 2012

PROJECT: Highway 368 south of St. Brieux

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Patching and spot sealing continues along Highway 368 between Grid 756 and St. Brieux

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Fresh oil and loose stones

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 374 near Scott

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 21, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Deep patching work on about 2 km of Highway 374 south of Scott

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Motorists should be cautious, obey all flag persons and slow to 60 km per hour when passing workers and equipment

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Week of June 11, 2012

PROJECT: Highway 953 near Anglin Lake

ESTIMATED COST: \$4.3 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Expected to begin Week of June 11, 2012 (Originally scheduled to start Week of May 14, 2012, delayed due to weather)

DESCRIPTION: About 11.5 km of work from the junction of Highway 953 and Highway 2 to the southwest, which includes widening the existing highway to accommodate the new surfacing structure and the placement of sand and gravel over the existing surface and a layer of gravel over the existing surface on about 2 km of roads on the Anderson Point Campground

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic may be reduced to one lane

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Summer 2012

PROJECT: Leroy Access Road near Highway 6

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Week of May 28, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Deep patching and spot filling continues along Leroy Access road to Highway 6

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Loose stones, expect delays

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: End of June 2012

PROJECT: West Regina Bypass Stage 2

ESTIMATED COST: \$42.5 million (Stage 2 grading work only)

START: Week of May 14, 2012

DESCRIPTION: Grading for a four-lane road connecting Trans-Canada Highway 1 to Dewdney Avenue in Regina and building embankments for an interchange at the junction of Highway 1 and Pinkie Road and a new railway overpass (work will focus on the interchange embankments in 2012)

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Traffic lights at the junction of Highway 1 and Pinkie Road, Slow to 60 km/h due to construction near Highway 1, traffic may be reduced to one lane in both directions

ESTIMATED/TARGETTED FULL OPENING TO TRAFFIC OF STAGE 2: 2013/14

PROJECT: Yorkton West Truck Route Project Phase 2 (Bypass connecting Highways 16 and 52)

ESTIMATED COST: \$4.1 million

START OF THIS YEAR'S CONSTRUCTION: Late April 2012

DESCRIPTION: About 6 km of grading and paving work for the construction of a bypass highway connecting Highway 16 and Grain Miller Road to Highway 52 and the construction of turning lanes at the intersection of Highway 52 and the bypass highway

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS: Motorist should be alert of large equipment working in the area

ESTIMATED COMPLETION: Fall 2012
