

### **Saskatchewan Assured Income for Disability (SAID) Program**

SAID is an income support program for people with significant and enduring disabilities, developed collaboratively by the Ministry of Social Services and the disability community. The program was designed to address two public policy goals: to assure a socially acceptable income for people with disabilities, recognizing the range of additional costs associated with disability; and to encourage and empower persons with disabilities to participate as fully as possible in community life according to their capacity and aspirations.
