



Media Backgrounder

- HealthLine provides health information and support 24 hours per day, free of charge.
- HealthLine is staffed by Registered Nurses and specially trained Social Workers.
- HealthLine has been available to residents of Saskatchewan since 2003.
- Stats for all calls to HealthLine:
 - HealthLine answers an average of 5,800 calls per month.
 - Calls are received from all health regions in the province, with the largest percentage of calls coming from the Regina Qu'Appelle and Saskatoon Health Regions.
 - The average length of a call when speaking with a Registered Nurse is 10.5 minutes.
 Mental Health related calls take a little longer, at an average of 12.5 minutes.

Top 10 reasons for **calls to Registered Nurses**:

Health concerns/symptoms

- Abdominal pain/discomfort
- Fever 3 months or older
- Chest pain/discomfort
- Cough (pediatric)
- Vomiting
- Nausea/vomiting
- Trauma head (pediatric)
- Rash
- Abrasions/lacerations/puncture wounds
- Diarrhea/change in bowel habit

Health information

- Shingles
- Hand-foot-and-mouth disease
- Plu shots
- Chicken pox
- 2 Lice
- Fever in children
- Insect bites and stings
- Tetanus shots
- Adult immunization schedule
- Colonoscopy

Top 10 Reasons for mental health calls:

- Anxiety
- Depression
- Alcohol abuse
- Drug abuse
- Other mental health disorder
- Suicide Ideation/suicide
- Stress
- Bipolar
- Schizophrenia
