New Schools to Support Growth Backgrounder

Joint-use schools are shared facilities typically between separate and public school divisions.

Short-term and long-term maintenance costs could be shared resulting in less cost to each school board. Joint-use also has the potential to strengthen partnerships between school divisions.

Production Preparation Process (3P) is a Lean tool that brings the stakeholders and the community together and involves them in the new design. The Five Hills Health region has used the 3P process in designing the new regional hospital in Moose Jaw which is expected to open in 2015.

2013 Growth Facts:

Below are some growth facts for the areas receiving joint-use schools, based on 2013 enrolment numbers.

Since 2007 and using 2013 actual enrolment figures the following communities have experienced the following increases due to growth:

- City of Martensville: Elementary school enrolment increased by 437 students or 52%.
- **City of Regina:** Elementary school enrolment increased (both divisions combined) by 3,369 students or 18%.
- **City of Saskatoon:** Elementary school enrolment increased (both divisions combined) by 4,256 or 20%.
- City of Warman: Elementary school enrolment increased by 428 students or 90%
- The weighted average of the four communities' enrolment growth is 20% vs. 9% for the entire province. The growth was calculated using 8,490 students and dividing by the actual enrolment for the four communities in 2007/2008.
