

# The need to (not) speed

Speed can kill. Photo speed enforcement can help change that.

To improve safety on Saskatchewan roads, a two-year photo speed enforcement pilot launched Dec. 8, 2014 in some of the highest-risk locations in the province. And it's having a positive effect.

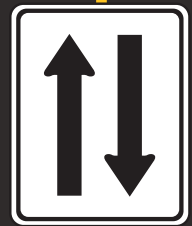


Photo speed enforcement targets



5 high-speed locations in and near Moose Jaw, Regina and Saskatoon

12 school zones throughout Moose Jaw, Regina and Saskatoon



As awareness goes up, violations go down.

## The highest speed recorded in January

In a **high-speed** location

**175 km/h**

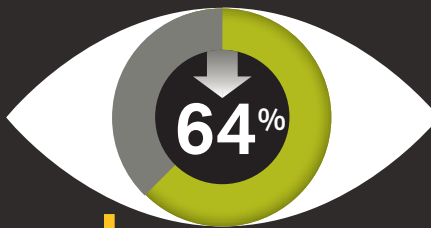
75 km/h over the posted speed limit



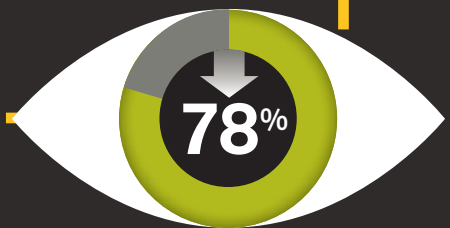
In a **school zone** during school hours

**75 km/h**

35 km/h over the posted speed limit



Comparing the number of violations (per day) in December to January, the greatest decrease at a high-speed location was **64%** (at Hwy 1 east) and in a school zone was **78%** (in Saskatoon).



**THE GOAL**

**Zero tickets. Zero crashes. Zero fatalities.**

Overall, comparing December to January\*

High-speed location violations **dropped 33%**



School zone violations **dropped 64%**
