

Saskatchewan Traffic Fatalities

Historical facts



In 2012, there were **183 people killed on Saskatchewan roads** and **more than 7,300 injured**. It prompted the formation of a Special Committee on Traffic Safety.

The committee's recommendations led to a number of significant new pieces of legislation and traffic safety initiatives over the following years:

<p>Establishment of the Combined Traffic Services Saskatchewan, which has added 120 new officers since 2014 to enforce traffic safety on our roads.</p>	<p>Stronger impaired driving laws and consequences (suspensions, impoundments, ignition interlock requirements) introduced in 2014 and 2017.</p>	<p>Mandatory booster seats for children under 7 years of age (2014).</p>
<p>Harsher penalties for extreme speeders (2014).</p>	<p>Bolstered distracted driving laws (2014 and 2017).</p>	<p>Introduction of photo speed enforcement (2015).</p>
