2020-21 Expense Highlight Provincial Municipal Support

- The 2020-21 Budget provides \$571.3M of direct provincial support to municipalities. This represents an increase of \$136.5M or 31.4 per cent due to increased municipal revenue sharing (\$26.5M) and the introduction of the Municipal Economic Enhancement Program 2020 (\$150M), partially offset by, fall-off in federal cost-shared infrastructure programs.
- Provincial Municipal Supports have increased by \$350.4M or 158.6 per cent from 2007-08. This is mostly due to a \$151.5M increase in municipal revenue sharing over that period and the recent introduction of the \$150M Municipal Economic Enhancement Program 2020.

Revenue Sharing

- The 2020-21 Budget includes \$278.1M for Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS), an increase of \$26.5M or 10.5 per cent from the 2019-20 Budget.
- MRS equals 0.75 of one point of Provincial Sales Tax revenue from 2018-19.
- Total funding will be allocated as follows:
 - \$178.3M, an increase of \$17.0M, to urban municipalities;
 - \$79.3M, an increase of \$7.5M, to rural municipalities; and,
 - \$20.6M, an increase of \$2.0M, to northern municipalities.
- This is an increase of \$151.5M or 119 per cent from 2007-08 Budget.

Infrastructure Funding

- The 2020-21 Budget includes \$247.4M in provincial support for municipal infrastructure, an increase of \$110.0M or 80.1 per cent from the 2019-20 Budget due to the introduction of the new Municipal Economic Enhancement Program (\$150M), partially offset by, fall-off in federal cost-shared infrastructure programs:
 - \$150M for the Municipal Economic Enhancement Program (Government Relations);
 - \$36.7M for the provincial portion of the New Building Canada Fund; the total amount including the federal portion is \$45.0M (Government Relations);
 - \$23.7M for the provincial portion of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program; the total amount including the federal portion is \$56.0M (Government Relations);
 - \$0.2M for the provincial portion of the Clean Water and Wastewater Fund; the total amount including the federal portion is \$0.6M (Government Relations);
 - \$28.0M for the Rural Integrated Roads for Growth Program (Highways and Infrastructure);
 - \$7.3M for the Urban Connector Program (Highways and Infrastructure); and,
 - \$1.5M for the Community Airports Partnership Program (Highways).

Other Funding

- The 2020-21 Budget includes \$45.8M in other funding for municipalities, a decrease of \$20K or 0.0 per cent from the 2019-20 Budget. Funding consists of:
 - \$18.8M in policing grants (Corrections and Policing);
 - \$11.2M grant to provincial libraries (Education);
 - \$9.0M for Grants in Lieu of Taxes to municipalities and libraries (Government Relations);
 - \$3.8M for the Transit Assistance for People with Disabilities Program (Government Relations);
 - \$1.6M for the Discount Bus Pass Program used by individuals and families who access SAP, SAID, TEA, SES, and Provincial Training Allowance (Social Services); and,
 - \$1.4M for the Strategic Partnership Program (Highways and Infrastructure).
