

First Nations and Métis Funding 2021-22

The 2021-22 Budget provides approximately \$193.6 million, an increase of \$5.7 million or 3.0 per cent from the 2020-21 Budget, for targeted program funding primarily for First Nations and Métis organizations or individuals. This funding excludes provincial expenditures that may be accessed by the general population, which also provide benefit to First Nations and Métis peoples. This rollup only captures funding from executive government. It does not include school divisions, post-secondary institutions or the Saskatchewan Health Authority.
