## 2021-22 Expense Highlight Provincial Municipal Support

- The 2021-22 Budget provides \$465.2M of direct provincial support to municipalities, a decrease of \$101.9M or 18.0 per cent, primarily as a result of fall-off from the one-time Municipal Economic Enhancement Program (\$150M), offset partially by increases in federally cost shared infrastructure programs.
- Excluding this one-year program, the year over year change would be a \$48.1M or 11.5 per cent increase.

## **Revenue Sharing**

- The 2021-22 budget includes \$275.7M for Municipal Revenue Sharing (MRS), a decrease of \$2.4M or 0.9 per cent from the 2020-21 Budget.
- This is an increase of \$149.1M or 117.8 per cent from 2007-08 Budget.
- MRS equals 0.75 of one point of Provincial Sales Tax revenue from 2019-20.

## **Infrastructure Funding**

- The 2021-22 budget includes \$140.1M in provincial support for municipal infrastructure, a decrease of \$101.6M or 42.0 per cent from the 2020-21 Budget due to fall-off of the one-time Municipal Economic Enhancement Program (MEEP), offset partially by increases in New Building Canada Fund (NBCF), Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program, and Strategic Partnership Program costs:
- \$56.3M for the provincial portion of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program; the total amount including the federal portion is \$123.9M (Government Relations);
- \$46.9M for the provincial portion of the New Building Canada Fund; the total amount including the federal portion is \$49.7M (Government Relations);
- \$28.0M for the Rural Integrated Roads for Growth (Highways and Infrastructure);
- \$6.6M for the Urban Highway Connector Program (Highways and Infrastructure); and,
- \$2.2M for the Strategic Partnership Program (Highways and Infrastructure).

## **Other Funding**

- The 2021-22 budget includes \$49.4M in other funding for municipalities, an increase of \$2.1M or 4.4 per cent from the 2020-21 budget. Funding consists of:
- \$19.0M in policing grants (Corrections and Policing);
- \$11.3M grant to provincial Libraries (Education);
- \$9.1M for Grants-in-Lieu of Taxes to municipalities and libraries (Government Relations);
- \$3.8M for the Transit Assistance for People with Disabilities Program (Government Relations);
- \$1.7M for the Community Rink Affordability Grant (Parks, Culture and Sport);
- \$1.6M for the Discount Bus Pass Program used by individuals and families who access SAP, SAID, SIS, SES, TEA, and Provincial Training Allowance (Social Services);
- \$1.5M for the Community Airports Partnership Program (Highways); and,
- \$1.4M grant funding for Urban Parks (Parks, Culture and Sport and Advanced Education).
