



Changes for Fully Vaccinated Individuals

Self-Isolation

- Those who are 14 days past their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine at time of exposure and are asymptomatic **may be exempted from** self-isolation if they are deemed a close contact of a COVID-19 positive person.
- The release from self-isolation **does not** apply to anyone with symptoms. Even if you have only relatively mild symptoms, you must immediately self-isolate.
- Anyone who has received only one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine **must still self-isolate** as directed by Public Health if they are named as close contacts.
- At this time, people must continue to self-isolate for 14 days following international travel, as per the [federal quarantine order](#).

Testing

- If a fully vaccinated person is exposed to COVID-19 and remains **asymptomatic**, there is no requirement for COVID 19 testing.
- However, there is still a requirement for health care workers and employees/residents at facilities including long-term and personal care homes, corrections facilities and congregate living settings such as group homes and shelters to be tested, if they are deemed as a close contact of someone who is COVID-19 positive.
