Interpersonal Violence and Abuse Community Service Organizations

Backgrounder – April 2024

The Government of Saskatchewan is investing \$42.6M in funding over the next three years to support interpersonal violence and abuse programs. The funding will be provided to 34 service organizations that deliver 54 different programs.

The following is a breakdown of funded agencies that provide a range of services for victims and survivors of interpersonal violence and abuse. Please note several organizations deliver multiple programs and are listed more than once.

Residential Transition Houses

<u>12 Residential Transition Houses</u> across the province provide safe shelter for women and their children leaving violence. Programs are delivered by:
