

DIV A- Crews will work the south flank from HWY 106 going east putting out the scanned areas that are hot and pulling out all equipment that is currently not being utilized.


DIV B- Crews will fly from Smeaton into helipad 44 and continue extinguishing marked spots as well as remove gear. Crews will also fly into helipad 50 from Smeaton and extinguish marked hotspots. Crews will then continue working spot off the ATV trail once this is completed and gear is demobilized. Crews will be moved into helipad 49 and work hot areas to the north, approximately 25 hose lengths away. The Shoe Fire is 58% contained.


Crews will begin demobilizing unused equipment starting with helipads 15 and 27. Crews and heavy equipment will be working hotspots north of Besnard junction, as well as off helipad 1 to continue efforts to contain the western edge of the excursion. Crews and heavy equipment will also work south of the Weyakwin base and east of HWY2 on an area of concern.

Dozer work has been completed, and wet lines are in place. There are a few buildings left at Amyot Lake Subdivision that will have values protection (VP) systems established. A few areas will be sprayed with gel July 4<sup>th</sup> where the distance prohibits a sprinkler system. VP systems will be reassessed July 4<sup>th</sup> morning and refined as needed.
