## 2018-19 Budget Highlights First Nations and Métis Funding

The 2018-19 Budget provides approximately \$200.2M, a decrease of \$3.1M or 1.5 per cent from the 2017-18 Budget, for targeted program funding primarily for First Nations and Métis organizations or individuals. This funding excludes provincial expenditures that may be accessed by the general population – expenditures which also provide benefit to First Nations and Métis peoples.

The change from 2017-18 reflects a decrease to Gaming transfer payments resulting from lower casino revenue forecasts, and savings for university programming in the north. Most other funding amounts remain unchanged from last year's budget.

The government pursues a number of strategies to involve First Nations and Métis people in Saskatchewan's economy and communities. The table below displays the targeted program funding:
